- 5. Presentation of 2012 Audit, Rubin Brown: Matt Beerbower and Cheryl Wallace of Rubin Brown reviewed the financials in the Report to Governance for the year ended December 31, 2012 document, stating the process went very well this year. Matt also reviewed the internal control communications and advisory section of the document which stated there were no disagreements with management during the course of the audit.

Pam received a call from the city of Brighton; they are expecting a visit from DOLA. We received funding from DOLA for the solar array at the Bennett and Brighton libraries. They are coming back around to see how the projects are faring and specifically asked to talk to the library.

Stacie reported on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Backyard Concert Series where even the rain could not spoil a good party, concert goers were brought indoors to enjoy an acoustic set by band Chimney Choir. About 80 people stayed to enjoy beer and dance by the fireplace. Next concert is August 9.

This year over ten thousand children and adults have signed up for the summer reading program.

Anythink will be participating in National Dance Day this year. Ronnie invites everyone to join in July 27 at 9:30 am in the parking lot at Wright Farms. There will be three practice sessions before the final group performance (info on handout).

A t-shirt design competition was held during the wranglers unite and concierges unite meetings this year. Ronnie brought in the t-shirts which are exclusive to the Wranglers and Concierges.
