Summer reading was a success. There has been a lot of interest in the volunteer program. New tech guide, Emily Woodward has started several classes which include; computer basics, email, and Microsoft word. Circulation statistics average 8700 per month with 8000 visitors per month.
- **6.** <u>Director's Report Pam Sandlian Smith</u>: Pam asked for Boards approval of a Resolution in Opposition to Amendments 60 & 61 and Proposition 101.

The Rangeview Library District received a Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the 2010 Budget from the Government Finance Officers Association. This is a huge credit to Mindy and her work including the work of the Administrative Team and the library Board. Our board's presentation at the Colorado Association of Libraries conference has been scheduled for October 9, at 10:45 am. A meeting to brainstorm for the presentation is set for Thursday, August 26 at 4:00 pm at the Huron branch. Congressman, Jared Polis has nominated the District for a National Medal from the Institute of Museum & Library Services. Each year five libraries and five museums that make extraordinary civic, educational, economic, environmental, and social contributions receive the award. The National Medal is the nation's highest honor for museums and libraries. Los Angeles Times reporter, David Sarno visited our libraries on Tuesday. He is doing a series on the future of reading; and the second part of the series is the future of libraries, consultant, Joan Frey Williams told him he should talk to us. He said we have lived up to his expectations and in many ways we have exceeded his expectations. At the last meeting we reviewed renderings for exterior signage and had a few revisions. New renderings were passed around.

7. <u>Finance Director's Report – Mindy Kittay</u>: Mindy handed out financial and statistic statements. Mindy asked the boards approval of three financial policies; Purchasing Policy, Purchasing Card Policy, and Debt Policy.

Motion to approve the Debt Policy, Purchasing Card Policy and Purchasing Policy was made by Linda Wisniewski and seconded by Dorothy Lindsey. Motion passed unanimously.
